



Safety Expo 2011, hosted by The City of Calgary and its corporate and community partners, is Calgary's premier event aimed at promoting safe environments at home, school and play. On March 9<sup>th</sup> and 10<sup>th</sup>, students will explore and take part in 30 interactive displays and 5 workshops designed to engage and educate them about making responsible decisions regarding their personal safety. They will also have the opportunity to tour the Calgary Police Interpretive Centre, reflect on their learning and participate in fun-filled, 10-minute Education Corner presentations that are held throughout the day. All activities are designed to have connections to Alberta Education curriculum outcomes.

This year's Expo will welcome over 3200 students, teachers and volunteers to the exhibits in City Hall atrium and workshops in the Public Library and EPCOR Centre. **Admission and bussing is free.** The Safety Expo is an educational and interactive opportunity for school children grades 4-7 to learn more about safety and injury prevention issues and initiatives by The City of Calgary, corporations and safety non-profit organizations that address those issues.
